

Family Reunification

Diane came to Just Solutions in 2022 for help to reunite with her 15 year old daughter, Zoé, living in a dangerous situation in Burundi. MCM volunteer Janet Dench (and former director of the Canadian Council for Refugees), was assigned her case and over the course of the next year, successfully guided Diane's application through to its acceptance. This included negotiating the complex interplay between Canadian immigration authorities, the medical systems in two countries, offices of the International Organization for Migration, and visa offices in Africa.

Zoé finally arrived at Trudeau Airport and became a Permanent Resident of Canada on June 3 of this year. She was greeted by her joyous mother after a years-long separation, and her Canadian baby sister whom she had never met! Congratulations Diane, welcome Zoé and kudos to Janet for a job well done reuniting this family!










Rêver à l'essentiel

Opening of an MCM antenna in Quebec City in spring 2025 with an initial pilot project represents a critical effort to help people with few resources navigate the immigration system.
